


E-learning and food security support by GoodWeave India



GoodWeave is making concerted efforts to ensure children of marginalized workers continue their learning through e-learning tools, and informal workers access food and essentials during the lockdown.

Helping at-risk children continue education in lockdown

GoodWeave is reaching out to 40,000-plus children in the worker and artisan communities across Indian states to support them with e-learning modules to help them continue their learning. Considering that education is one of the worst hit during this crisis, our small efforts are sure to make a big difference in the lives of the children.

Helping informal workers in accessing food and essentials in lockdown

GoodWeave India team is reaching out to over 90,000 workers in the informal supply chains spread across Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan and parts of Kerala and West Bengal to offer them all possible support.

Using available worker data, GoodWeave India team is making phone calls as well as connecting through WhatsApp to offer workers information and awareness about the COVID-19

crisis, ways to keep oneself protected, as well as enquiring about their immediate short-term needs.

The GoodWeave team is taking a step ahead and linking workers with available sources of support such as government's relief schemes as well as local NGOs providing support to workers.

GoodWeave is also utilising its leverage and network with its licensee partner exporters and contractors to help workers access food grains and basic essentials.

In case support is not available from other sources, GoodWeave is arranging food grains and essentials directly to provide immediate support to workers

Our Lockdown Footprint

4,546 workers assisted in accessing food grains and essentials

26,828 community members received awareness on COVID-19 crisis, handwashing, and social distancing

8,099 subcontractors, contractors, and home-based workers in the supply chains contacted by phone to provide awareness and collect information about the food and safety of their workers

2,390 at-risk children receiving e-learning classes through WhatsApp-based assignments

400 at-risk children connected with e-learning classes initiated by the government schools using WhatsApp
